### Ethical??

Jack, an industrial hygienist working for Chemo Pharmaceutical Manufacturing, is tasked with selecting an industrial hygiene lab to conduct analysis of air and surface samples related to a new chemotherapy drug. Jack has narrowed the lab selection to two vendors—IH Analysis Lab and NJ Pharma Labs.

Jack’s evaluation reveals that IH Analysis has new liquid chromatography tandem mass spectrometry equipment, which is necessary to conduct the specialized analysis and can exceed the minimum detection limit required. SUMMARY:

Updates regulations governing lead-related construction work to conform to federal rules, or be more stringent. Requires a request for authorization to enforce provisions of that rule and, to adopt regulations establishing procedures pursuant to which a local law enforcement agency may carry out enforcement activities. Requires related education and outreach. Prohibits such construction on a structure by a person which conducted the related inspection. Provides for license revocation for violations.
